#### **Changes:**

My research was conducted according to my research plan, based on my project time-table. As a consequence, though there are numerous problematic points concerning the Hungarian education strategies I realised the importance to concentrate on integration programmes and strategies, especially because the numerous school—unification process makes this problem very actual and current to investigate.

### **Future research activities**

My research paper and policy paper are based on the findings of the field work that I did mostly in the northern part of Hungary where Romani students live in a high proportion. The research focuses on segregation of Romani students and examines the local implementation of the integration policy of the Ministry of Education that aims to improve the conditions. It reveals the impact and the success of the education strategy of the Ministry that aims to promote the integration of Romani children in primary schools.
