

Public-Private Relationships



Public-Private Partnerships (PPP)

- Market driven R&D not always responds to health problems experienced or to identified public needs
- Governments of poorer countries lack funds (and skills) and of affluent countries have limited capacity to provide sufficient international aid
- Civil sector has enthusiasm but lacks funding and administrative capacity for larger changes



A cooperative venture between the public and private sectors, built on the expertise of each partner, that best meets clearly defined public needs through the appropriate allocation of resources, risks and rewards.

International and EU initiatives

- Global Forum for Health Research (10/90 Gap) over 90 PPPs in 10 categories
- NIH has recently established Public-Private Partnership Programme Office
- CCPPP Canadian Council of Public-Private Partnerships
- FP6 encouraged research involvement of SMEs and private NPOs through funding up to 50% of their project costs



Balkan Countries - GERD

- Macedonia: only 0.3% of GDP (2004)
- Croatia: 1.1% of GDP (2003)
- Romania: 0.4% of GDP (2004)
- Serbia: 0.32% of GDP (2003)
- **B&H:** no reliable data
- Albania: no data

- German private NPOs commenting FP7 participation and funding criteria (from 50% to 75% - equal opportunity with 100%)
- EPHA, EUPHA contributions towards EU PH and R&D policies
