## **RESEARCH INTERESTS**

I am committed to the advancement of **geographical political economy**, with its focus on modern capitalist social formations as spatially and temporally uneven and highly variegated systems. I combine the theoretical insights and methodologies of Economic Geography, Urban & Regional Studies, and Comparative Political Economy to explore, dissect, and illuminate the following two research themes:

- *Urban and regional economy*: economic growth and decline of cities and urban regions; varieties of territorial development strategies; regional convergence and

- divergence; urban shrinkage, adaptation, resilience, and resurgence;
- *Comparative geography of public finance*: the spatial distribution of national income and the role of central government transfers; fiscal federalism, budgetary politics, and territorial cohesion; local government finance and urban austerity.

### ***Cities and Regions: Changing Spatial Imbalances***

Working in close collaboration with Ivan Turok (Department of Urban Studies, University of Glasgow) at the CPPR, I undertook a large research project on understanding spatial economic change and changing urban imbalances in Europe. The project examined the diverse trajectories and variable performance of cities across Western and Eastern Europe, drew out the implications for urban and regional development policy, and engaged with public policy stakeholders, including the HM Treasury. The media coverage of the project included the BBC, *Guardian*, *Financial Times*, *Irish Independent*, *Newcastle Evening Chronicle*, *Glasgow Evening News*, *Aberdeen Press & Journal*, and other outlets.

*October 2006 – September 2008*

***Neoliberalism, Anti-Neoliberalism, and De-Ideologisation***

Jointly with Kean Birch and Katherine Trebeck at the CPPR, I ran a special seminar series financed by the UK Economic and Social Research Council. The seminar series considered neo-liberalism an ideology characterised by an antipathy towards state involvement in economic exchange and an emphasis on the benefits of market forces. It illustrated the ascendancy of neo-liberal processes, rules and institutions, and highlighted the impact that such an ideology have on social research and policy, especially where it is presented as a technocratic rather than political matter. The seminar series provided a forum in which both senior and junior academics were able to engage in dialogue with each other and with research users, broadly defined. It resulted in the publication of an edited volume on *The Rise and Fall of Neoliberalism* (Birch and Mykhnenko, 2010).

***Shrink Smart - Governance of Shrinkage within a European Context***

This collaborative research grant project was funded through the European Union's Seventh Research Framework Programme (FP7). The project was based on comparative case studies from ten cities and conurbations throughout Europe with a focus on disadvantaged urban regions in eastern, southern, and western Europe, suffering from economic decline, population loss, and a lack of social cohesion. I lead four out of ten work packages, co-ordinating 7 national research teams in the Czech Republic, Germany, Italy, Poland, Romania, UK, and Ukraine. In addition, as a Principal Investigator on the Donetsk-Makiivka case study, for three years I ran a research team of 3 academics at the Industrial Economics Institute, Donetsk, Ukraine. The project explored different trajectories of shrinkage, exposed the main challenges for urban political economy, and elaborated alternatives for urban governance. The project's recommendations had a significant impact upon the ongoing reform of the European urban and regional policy by the European Commission.
